Child Care:

Our child care department is very busy in processing the applications for the admission of the children.

Two of our students Ms. Selvarani and Mr. Vinoth Kannan have finished their B.P.T (Bachelor of Physiotherapy) degree and joined in one of our satellite programme RUADT to serve the handicapped children in and around Theni district. We are very happy see our children coming out very successful in their studies and being settled.

After the completion of the final exams in the school the children went for the holidays to their parents and the relatives. All the Children's Villages look empty with very few children. They will come back on May 20th.



An intensive English course was arranged for +2 completed students for one month. Fr. Selvanayagam was leading the group. The students were happy to attend the course and they expressed they were very confident in learning a language.

Education:



One of our regular summer features is summer camp for children. This helps them to use the time to learn something very leisurely. Around 130 are benefiting from it. Things like computer, dance and spoken English are taught to them.

We received text books for the students from government. Thanks to the education authorities for their kindness to us.



At Silvarpatti mobile tailoring unit certificates were issued to 31 ladies. On the same day a new patch was starting their course. It is 3rd patch in the same village to have tailoring training.

Medical:

As the government formalities for running any charitable activities are on the increase we find not worth running the shelter for the aged people. Our total capacity is only 10 and we had only five elderly people. Therefore we have transferred them to another home run by another organisation and one or two preferred to be with their relatives.
